### INTRODUCTION

This ANNUAL PRIVACY POLICY FOR CALIFORNIA RESIDENTS (“California Notice”) supplements the information contained in the [main Policy](#) applicable to eQ Technologic, Inc. (“we” or “us”) and applies solely to individuals who reside in the State of California (“consumers” or “you”). This California Notice sets out how we use and protect any personal information you may have provided to us through your use of the Services, by computer or mobile device, social media, by phone via text message, in writing or otherwise. We adopt this California Notice to comply with the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 (“CCPA”), its implementing regulations, and other applicable California privacy laws.
